General Labourers

General Labourers are required on the Quartz Creek Bridge Project all throughout the 2022 construction season.

Job Profile Overview:

As described by the ITA, labourers perform physical tasks such as assembling and disassembling temporary structures, installing and removing concrete forms, mixing, pouring and spreading materials such as concrete and asphalt, digging trenches, compacting earth, cleaning, removing debris, loading and unloading materials, reading and following construction plans and blueprints and assisting skilled craftspeople with their duties. The job of a labourer varies from day to day. They perform a variety of duties involving tool use, lifting, carrying, and managing equipment and machinery to provide support and aid to the skilled craftspeople on-site.

Working Conditions:

- Extended shift hours, in changing weather conditions
- Noisy and dusty environments on dynamic terrains
- Busy job environment with multiple trades working together
- Standing and moving on uneven terrain
- Personal Protective Equipment will be required (e.g., steel-toed safety boots, safety glasses/goggles, etc.)
- Construction jobs may require workers to be in good physical condition with an ability to work long hours.

Experience, qualifications, and certifications that are considered an asset:

- Valid Red Seal, Journey Person or Apprenticeship Construction Craft Worker certification considered an asset
- Experience working in heavy civil construction or road building considered an asset
- Ability to operate electric hand tools in a safe and efficient manner considered an asset
- Must be comfortable working around heavy equipment
- Follow instructions and basic design specifications
- Assist on general maintenance of the construction site
- Ability to lift 50 lbs.
- Experience working with concrete considered an asset
- Fall Protection, Ariel Work Platform and Confined Space Entry considered an asset
- OFA Level 1 considered an asset

- Must have good observation skills, as well as the ability to handle multiple tasks
- Must have good interpersonal, as well as communication skills
- Have an understanding and the ability to follow safe work procedures
- Site Ready BC including WHMIS (details will be provided by BCIB upon employment)
