General Labourers

General Labourers are required on the Highway 1 – Four Laning Project at the Kicking Horse Canyon Phase Four project site all throughout the 2022 construction season.

Job Profile Overview:

As described by the ITA, labourers perform physical tasks such as assembling and disassembling temporary structures, installing and removing concrete forms, mixing, pouring and spreading materials such as concrete and asphalt, digging trenches, compacting earth, cleaning, removing debris, loading and unloading materials, reading and following construction plans and blueprints and assisting skilled craftspeople with their duties. The job of a labourer varies from day to day. They perform a variety of duties involving tool use, lifting, carrying, and managing equipment and machinery to provide support and aid to the skilled craftspeople on-site.

Working conditions and other requirements:

- Extended shift hours, in changing weather conditions
- Working in a canyon environment on steep slopes and exposed rockfaces.
- Busy, noisy and dusty environments on dynamic terrains with multiple trades working together.
- Personal Protective Equipment will be required (e.g., steel-toed safety boots, safety glasses/goggles, etc.)
- Must be prepared to work nights as required
- Construction jobs may require workers to be in good physical condition with an ability to lift heavy weight.
- Ability to follow instructions and basic design specifications
- Must have good observational skills and the ability to multitask
- Have a good understanding and the ability to follow safe work procedures
- Have good communication, interpersonal and coordination skills

Experience, qualifications, and certifications that are considered an asset:

- Valid Red Seal, Journey Person or Apprenticeship Construction Craft Worker certification considered an asset
- Experience working in heavy civil construction or road building considered an asset
- Experience installing culverts and catch basins
- Experience working with concrete

- Ability to operate electric hand tools in a safe and efficient manner considered an asset
- Assist with general maintenance of the construction site
- Ability to lift 50 lbs.
- Fall Protection, Ariel Work Platform and Confined Space Entry considered an asset
- Class 5 Drivers License or higher considered an asset
- OFA Level 1 considered an asset
- Site Ready BC including WHMIS (details will be provided by BCIB upon employment)
